Subject: Public Comment on NISP WRDA 214 Public Notice, dated April 2, 2013

Dear Ms. Chieply:

As indicated in Natural Energy's enclosed Central Colorado Project Memo, dated April 8, 2013, Colorado's Northern Integrated Supply Project (NISP) is an obsolete concept that would excessively deplete Colorado's Upper Colorado River tributaries.

Instead of proceeding with NISP, I respectfully suggest USACOE's participation with an emergency EIS scoping and modeling evaluation of Central Colorado Project's (CCP) **no-net-cost** solution for Front Range and regional water and energy needs. Under this proposal, the State of Colorado could be CCP's developer/owner and USBR would probably be the lead federal agency for permitting and development.

Thank you for favorably considering Natural Energy's game changing concept for solving state and regional water and energy needs for droughts, growth, and climate change.
